

We are honored to have a First Class Relic of St. Carlos Acutis, on loan from the Diocese of Fall River. Please come and join us to venerate this relic of the first millennial saint the weekend of September 20-21, 2025. The Relic will be at all Masses!

Carlo Acutis was born May 3, 1991. From a young age, Carlo had a special love for God and the rosary. After he made his first Communion, he went to Mass as often as possible. Carlo's love for the Eucharist also inspired a deep conversion for his mother. According to the postulator promoting his cause for sainthood, he "managed to drag his parents to Mass every day. It was not the other way around." Carlo's witness of faith led other adults to convert and be baptized. He was not afraid to defend Church teaching and was faithful friend, especially for kids at school who got bullied, and kids with disabilities. Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia as a teenager. Before his death in 2006, he offered his sufferings for Pope Benedict XVI and for the Church, saying: "I offer all of my suffering to the Lord for the pope and for the Church in order not to go to purgatory but to go straight to heaven." Carlos was canonised as a saint on 7 September 2025. Acutis has been referred to as the "patron saint of the Internet", "God's Influencer" and the "first millennial saint".
