- · reading the daily Gospel,

- · keeping Sunday as a day centered on Christ and the Holy Eucharist.

These small acts of faith create space for Christ to enter our homes and hearts.

Advent is a journey—a walk of faith, hope, and love. Let us make this journey together. May the Blessed Virgin Mary, who waited for the Lord with perfect trust, accompany us and draw us ever closer to her Son.

May God bless you and your loved ones this Advent – and beyond – as we together prepare our hearts for the coming of our Savior. I look forward to celebrating this Advent season and Christmas with you and your loved ones! Jesus is coming—let us be ready!
